Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I found this little story that I wanted to share with you:

A little boy and his father were driving down a country road on a beautiful spring afternoon. Suddenly out of nowhere a bumblebee flew in the car window. Since the little boy was deathly allergic to bee stings, he became petrified. But the father quickly reached out, grabbed the bee, squeezed it in his hand, and then released it. But as soon as he let it go, the young son became frantic once again as it buzzed by the little boy. His father saw his panic-stricken face. Once again the father reached out his hand, but this time he pointed to his hand. There still stuck in his skin was the stinger of the bee. "Do you see this?" he said. "You don't need to be afraid anymore. I've taken the sting for you."

And this is the message of Easter. We do not need to be afraid of death anymore. Christ faced death for us. And by His victory, we are saved from sin. Christ has taken the sting! Paul tells us in 1 Corinthians 15:53–57(ESV), 53 "For this perishable body must put on the imperishable, and this mortal body must put on immortality. 54 When the perishable puts on the imperishable, and the mortal puts on immortality, then shall come to pass the saying that is written:

'Death is swallowed up in victory.'
55 'O death, where is your victory?
O death, where is your sting?'
56 The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law.
57 But thanks be to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ."

Christ has taken the stinger for us. He has risen! Fear is gone. New life is ours. Christ is risen! He is Risen Indeed!...You finish the rest!

Elders' Report – Jim Wirch reported that the Board of Elders met on Monday, March 4, 2024

- After reviewing Pastor Pett's monthly reports from February the May 2024 Worship Service Volunteer Schedule was completed.
- The Elders continue to study the book of Ephesians
- Earlier the Elders had decided to eliminate the early (4:00 pm) Advent worship service following suggestions in the survey with the goal of worshipping together instead of splitting into two groups. Since then, several members have expressed concerns that no 4:00PM service would eliminate the opportunity for some to worship and requested that the elders reconsider the decision. After discussion it was voted upon to reinstate the 4:00 pm Advent service.
- A suggestion in the Survey was to increase organ prelude music before worship services. Bob Rivers suggested ideas to blend different music styles in our services and different timings. Llew Kramer will approach the Praise Team and see what the consensus is from them regarding these suggestions and their availability.
- Doug Laatsch gave an update on our video system. Video cameras on our campus will soon number 18, which is total coverage for the church and school buildings.

Executive Committee

NEWSLA — Jean Borchardt reported that there was \$50,00 net profit for NEW Auction

- The Trinity Auction had about 300 attendees
- A building committee is meeting to investigate options for a Trinity expansion.
- They are currently looking for another Preschool Director and/or one or more teachers at Faith Christian Preschool
- Chad Welch hired as a Guidance Counselor & History Teacher as well as managing the International Student program
- Jared Gosse (Athletic Director) has submitted his resignation, effective July 1, 2024
- All 3 schools are working on Accreditation— the paperwork has been submitted and they are waiting for the site visits in April
- Based on the results from the Strategic Study, a “Mission/Vision/Core Values” committee has been formed and has been meeting regularly to unify the 3 schools in these areas.

Mission & Ministry, Marsha Gomoll noted that:

- A VBS survey has been made and looking now for input & volunteers from congregation
- They are working on “Parables in the Park” — as an outreach idea
- Church Picnic—waiting for Packer's schedule to come out in order to set date & reserve the shelter at Colburn
- Tithe of Elmer Dotz monies: distributed to St. John's Homeless Shelter, Golden House, Freedom House — each received \$5000, but through the “Give Big Green Bay” Grant Program, the amounts given to each group were doubled. House of Hope received the last \$1400
- Have received thank you notes from the recipients

Board of Property -Wesley Pett reported:

- Storage shed — a little glitch came from the City of Green Bay and will need to re-design it as a steel building because of fire codes of a lumber building too close to our building
- Security Cameras —will have 18 , currently have 14 set up and running
- Handicapped bathroom for school – wall needs to be stabilized, getting more information and bids for this
- Sound Dampening Panels for the gym— still need an estimate
- New Cushions for the former stage wall — measurements have been taken and will be ordered
- Future projects include: painting, remodel meeting rooms in the school (first) and the church buildings, weeding and cleaning up the outside property

Executive Committee

Financial Report —Ross Corey and Randy Pfister reported that February total offerings were \$29,500, and total income came in at \$32,000. Our expenses were \$623 more than what we received, but Year To Date — income is up and expenses are stable (5.5% increase in pledged offerings). Overall we have about \$2,000 in the positive for the last 7 months.

OLD BUSINESS:

- Dotz Estate funds— disbursements update for tithe amounts (see Mission & Ministry above)
- Congregational survey— will itemize things that can be done now, done later and the “don’t do” list

NEW BUSINESS:

- There was a discussion about approval for future expenditures: some/all expenditures of a certain threshold amount? —if it is “x” \$ — it goes through the Executive Committee, if it is over “y” the congregation gets involved... Ross made a motion and seconded by Marsha “Any project that is above \$25,000 must be brought before the executive Committee meeting for approval before starting and anything above \$100,000 must be brought before the congregation for approval at a Congregational Meeting
- Executive Committee meeting on April 16, 2024— to talk about survey and budget
- Next Congregational Meeting is May 5, 2024

Adjournment and Prayer: Ross Corey made the motion to adjourn, Wesley Pett seconded and Pastor Pett led us in closing prayer.

j!LL's 3 Year Update

It's always an encouragement to hear how my prayers for others were answered. So, I want to encourage you all with an update...

Many of you met "Miss Peggy", my first prosthetic leg. There are 4 levels of technology/lifestyle. A Level 1 person will never walk; Level 4 is for elite athletes, "Para-Olympians", military users. My physicians classify me as Level 3. That qualifies me for a leg that has a microprocessor ankle, power knee and a couple other bells and whistles. The problem with Miss Peggy was that she would fall off due to poor fit and was painful to wear; last year I only wore the leg 6x, and that was to go in my basement to look for things. My new leg has an adjustable socket that adapts to change. "Arna" was made in Iceland, so needs an appropriate name: it means "Mountain of Strength" and "Power & Might". Once I put on my leg and the "Whole Armor of God", I'm ready for battle.

Last year, 2023, we had several setbacks, besides a leg that didn't fit. The first 3 months, I had pneumonia, while trying to care for my brother who lived with us while in hospice care. In February, exposure to toxic new-construction chemicals at my doctor's clinic knocked me out with severe obstructive asthma. Then last month, my therapists moved to the new Bellin clinic in Ashwaubenon...major setback with the asthma again, plus I can't see my therapists.

Since being 2 years cancer free, we go to the City of Hope (formerly Cancer Treatment Centers of America) every 6 months instead of every 3. I am independent and home alone most every day, though family members often check on me. Home therapy takes about 3 hours/day. I try to wear my leg 2-3x/week, when someone is here with me. No one trusts me to walk alone, even though today is 2 years since I last fell. I can walk alone in parallel bars or with a walker; I do best when Nate holds one hand and I have a cane in the other. I never get very far, due to ever-present exhaustion and lack of strength/stamina. I don't schedule more than one activity/day; leaving the house to shop, attend church or keep an appointment usually means resting the next 2 days.

My brain continues to heal. Focus is improving to the point where I am able to prepare meals and follow a complicated recipe. All last year, I didn't make anything with more than 5 ingredients and a short paragraph of instructions. I still get overwhelmed in large groups, especially with loud noise.

I give God all the credit that I rarely feel discouraged. I have no time for it, when I focus on gratitude. God bless you all for continued prayers, cards, gifts and so much love. I can't tell you how much it means to me and my family.
